TRAIN THE TRAINER: BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN EDUCATION

We can train your staff to teach the basics of Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Education!

- Watching for all traffic signs and signals
- Choosing routes that provide space to walk and have the least amount of traffic and lowest speeds
- * Looking for traffic at all driveways and intersections
- ★ Wearing a properly fitted bicycle helmet
 - Using hand signals for crossing an intersection
 - Access to ODOT bicycle fleets, adaptive bikes, balance bikes, pedestrian safety kits, and curriculum

GRANT FUNDING

CONSTRUCTION TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

SRTS Planning:

Planning Assistance (formerly known as the Project Identification Program or PIP) offers professional consultant planning support to communities to develop a SRTS Plan that includes infrastructure recommendations to overcome key barriers to school access.

Surface Treatments:

Surface Treatments (formerly known as the Quick Build Program) is a program that provides professional consultant technical support to design and install simple, low-cost infrastructure that enables students to walk or roll (by bike or mobility device) to school.

Engineering Assistance:

Engineering Assistance is a program that provides professional consultant technical support to communities to design priority infrastructure that enables students to walk or roll (by bike or mobility device) to school.



RAPID RESPONSE GRANTS

Rapid Response Grant applications are always open to tribes, cities, counties, or road authorities to provide an immediate infrastructure change in response to a fatality or urgent concern related to students walking and rolling to school. Construction Grant applications
approximately every two years
for cities, tribes, counties, or road
authorities to fund street safety in
the right-of-way within a one-mile
radius of schools, in order to help
